Financial Need

The North Seattle College Financial Aid Office assists students in the process of applying for financial aid and finding ways to meet education expenses. Financial aid is designed to assist students and/or their parents in paying basic educational costs for eligible certificate and degree programs. The financial aid programs at North Seattle College are administered in accordance with established state and federal regulations and policies. The basic federal formula for determining financial need for funding is based on the following equation:

Cost of Attendance (COA)
- Estimated Family Contribution (EFC)
= Financial Need

** EFC is determined by the information students submit on their FAFSA/WASFA and verified by the financial aid office.

Cost of Attendance

The following student budgets (cost of attendance) are estimated expenses for a student at full-time enrollment (12+ credits per quarter). Your total financial aid awards, including grants, loans, work-study, and scholarships, cannot exceed your student budget. Costs related to students with disabilities may be submitted for consideration; although, funding for these costs may be limited. Student budgets can include only the student's direct educational costs; other family expenses cannot be included in the budget. Financial Aid awards will be pro-rated to accommodate lower enrollment levels.
