Thanks to the creativity and follow-through of Joyce Hansen and her Web Services team, some great new online tools are now available. (Please be sure to bring your SID and PIN so you can log in to try things out during the hands-on portion of the workshop.) Enrollment Reports is a web-based application that can track critical enrollment data in near real time, and lets you view enrollments for all the classes you teach (all courses or eLearning courses) all on one screen. You can even build custom reports by a number of useful criteria, and save them for comparison and later reference. Instructor Notes is a simple, yet powerful, tool that lets instructors insert custom messages directly into the Online College Catalogue. For example, "Please arrive 10 minutes early and bring your toolkit to the first class" or the URL for the course website. Course Evaluations provides a handy interface for ordering evaluations online, lists all quarterly due dates, and allows you to easily review the feedback from your students. Finally, the Faculty Grants Tour will highlight Faculty Development and Curriculum Development Grants information and availability, and other useful features of the Faculty Development website.
