

# **EMERGENCY & TRANSITIONAL HOUSING**

## **Rita House- Main Office: (253)-833-5271**

Part of Catholic Community Services. Transitional Housing (2 years). Must be over 18, in recovery, female and with no children. Requirements while in housing: Attend 3 AA/NA meetings a week, Submit random UA's when requested, make a budgeting plan, go to your outpatient/Intensive Outpatient, and do weekly chores as well as a deep clean. You and your case manager will complete housing applications and work off a plan to pay off your debt. You have your own room. Curfew is at 10pm Sunday-Thursday and 12am Friday and Saturday. You must work towards having an income (work, GAU, GAX etc.) and rent is 30% of your income.

## **Homestep- Arika Patneau: (206)-525-1213 ext.3116**

Part of the Church Council of Greater Seattle Transitional Housing (2 YEARS) Eligibility Must be referred by a service provider. Be a single parent, Be 18 years old or older, Be safe from being actively pursued by an abusive person, Have a source of income not less than the TANF (Temporary Aid to Needy families) grant for the family size (Sometimes you can be eligible by going to school) Be willing to abide by program requirements. Be motivated to achieve goals and open to receiving support from a case manager. There is also a young adult program (for people without children). You will be in your own apartment. Advocate will come and meet you once a week and will have you complete housing applications. Also Advocates have a lot of resources to refer you to. Housing Checks are once a month. No UA's unless suspected drug use. Rent is 30% of your income and Homestep also pays up to \$70.00 on your electric bill.

## **Plymouth Housing Group- Main Office: (206)-374-9409**

Many housing programs permanent and transitional. Here is 3 of the main ones (The Coming Home Program, The Housing Support Program, The Begin at Home Program) This housing is an all over program they provide things the client needs to succeed and not be homeless anymore(Life skills, drug and alcohol counseling, mental health, etc.) To qualify 18 and over and call to see what ones you are eligible for.

### **Broadview- Main Office: (206)-299-2500**

For woman and children. Clients stay in a furnished apartment. There is a transitional housing and emergency shelter program. Transitional program (1 year) client must be referred from service provider. Meet with case manager once a week. Weekends are allowed to be out. Curfew Sunday-Thursday 10pm; Friday and Saturday 12am. Emergency Program: client can refer themselves. Also has a reuniting program (women trying to reunite with their children ok). Maximum stay 5-6 weeks. Both programs you must be over 18.

Serves ages 13-17. Maximum stay is 3-4 months a year. Curfew is between 5pm and 8:30pm. Must be gone in the morning by 7:30am. Random UA's once a week. Smoking breaks two (10 minute breaks a night). Cannot have run report on youth, no parental permission required.

## **Youth Care**

***Shelter- Shelter manager (206)-267-3070***

Ages 12-17. Parental permission required. No open run report can be on the youth. Required to be in school, if graduated, must be looking for work or working. Required to go to weekly group meetings at house. Fills out housing applications with case worker. Cannot come and go as they please. Must get passes to leave other than school. Maximum stay is 1 month

**Pathways-Karin Effland (206)-985-0444**

Ages 16-17, may take age 15 if mature. May take 1-6 months to get into the program. You must fill out an application then be referred and then get an interview. Eligibility: you cannot be a sex offender and must be 90 days sober or be in treatment with your case manager's letter of recommendation. Program requirements: random UA's, meet with your primary once a week, attend life skills once a month, drug and alcohol/ housing meetings once a week, must be going to school or working, and doing 30 productive hours a week. No rent. clients are on a level system (What you can and cannot do). Curfew varies by level (9pm to 12pm)
